If there are not and it is a safety concern then these pupils may need to access remote learning as per their individual risk assessments Office staff- tasks prioritised and overtime granted to those willing to take it on SLT/DSL- There must be at least 1 DSL on site and one available remotely. If the Head/Deputy and Assistant Head are unavailable for work there must be other SLT available to step up.
