

School starts back for the pupils on 6th September 2022.



We used scales to compare items to see which were heavier and lighter and then practised using Unifix to see how heavy each items was. Eventually we moved on to use electronic scales to see if we could measure to a specific amount and practised this in our cooking sessions as we made chocolate cakes!



Lion class have been working really hard on their Science work. We have been visiting the local park and looking at the environment, bugs, animals, flowers and trees.

The class have learnt to identify them all and know how we can best look after our environment and care for the creatures in it.


We have also had transition days to get us ready for the new school year. Another really successful half term.






