
'A Time to Talk' is back!

Class News




This half term Octopus have been learning about space!

In their ART lessons they have been designing and creating space related ART. They designed and created their own spaceships! **Great work!**






They thought about which materials they should use, before following their designs and building their rockets.

We have been really impressed with progress the students have made at Pathways this Half-Term, as they continue to build their independence, communication and coping skills. It has also been a time when students and families have been visiting local colleges and making big decisions about their next placement, which will start in September next year.

At the college, the students have been cooking different meals, learning practical skills such as First Aid with the support of the Red Cross, and digging over a patch of the garden with pupils from Parkside, to create our vegetable plot ready for next year.

Outside of college we have visited Cromer, Great Yarmouth and have started to travel by bus into Norwich City Centre. Several of the students are also carrying out weekly work experience and receiving rave reviews from their employers.

The official opening of Surlingham House (Pathways College) is on the afternoon of the 15th December and it will be lovely to see some of you then, to share our story.


MOON BREAD RECIPE - Anna Wilson

How about having a go at making some for yourself at home?










the yeast,


Things some of our network members are doing:






