Lessons

We have been focussing on wheeled transport this half term with a big focus on balance and fitness for cycling.

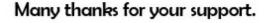


Sparkly Non-Uniform Day Friday 3rd November 2023.

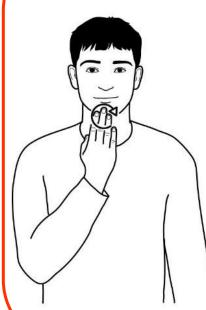
Parents' Evening on 7 November 2023

Well done Jellyfish class for a fantastic half term!



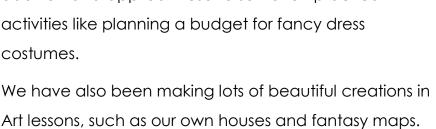
Octopus Class have been enjoying our topic work about Homes and Families this half term.

We particularly enjoyed learning to act out the verb "tiptoed" and following reading Widgit instructions to tiptoe, jump, hop and skip from place to place in the sensory playground! We are looking forward to creating new endings for our story.

We have been mapping out our classroom, going on a shape hunt to different classrooms around the school and have looked at old photos of Parkside. Leopard class loved exploring Parkside, comparing the new parts of the school to the old ones.

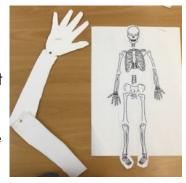
Year 11 have used their research and budgeting skills to renovate our Sycamore common room. We have put in an order and are excited about creating a calm and relaxing space to spend leisure time.

We have been learning about homes and families with our sensory story 'Little Red Riding Hood' and have learnt about the characters using songs and signing.







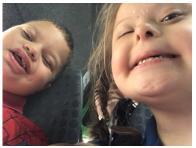
Crocodile class has been going on two trips every week!

But before we look at themes and books, let's start with a look at how life skills like cooking are built into our everyday curriculum - cake anyone?...





















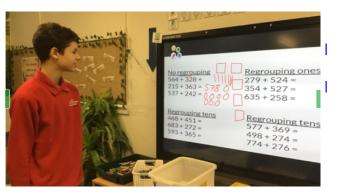






In Numeracy we have explored the concepts of concrete, pictorial and abstract to help our understanding of decimal places:

The new play equipment in the playground has been a real hit, and with lots of discussions around what is "safe" the students are learning.





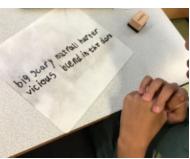


Literacy, communications and phonics are all going really well.



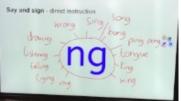
Our book this half term is Little Red Riding hood and we've looked at adjectives to describe the wolf.

Pathways College

Our students have been amazing in their first few weeks at college. They have risen to the challenge of trying new learning experiences to support their independence, communication and coping skills, as they prepare for their next college placement and adulthood.

These experiences have included using the public bus when visiting the supermarket to do the weekly shop, plus trips to the UEA, Eaton Park and Norwich City Centre. When we are not out in the community, we are cooking in our purpose built kitchen, carrying out gardening activities on our allotment, maintaining the independence flat and completing City & Guilds Entry Level maths and English qualifications.

This Half Term also sees us going on a week's residential during October, at Kingswood, in Overstrand. Students will have the opportunity to practise their self-care skills away from home and build resilience through exposure to adventurous outdoor activities.

Well-done to all at Pathways, it has been a great start to the year!

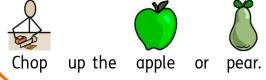


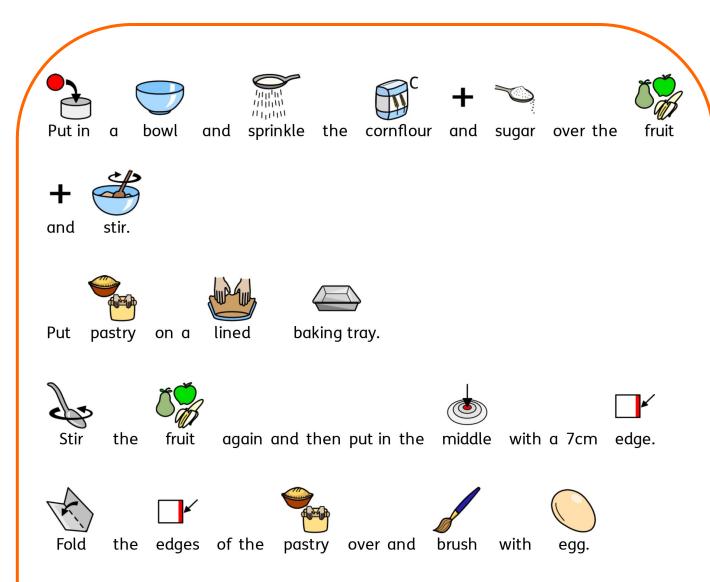
















Financial Support for Families
